This article is contingent upon the Town Meeting's approval of Article 7, and, if the Town Meeting does not approve Article 7, this Article shall be null and void.

15. Shall the Town of Newton vote in accordance with RSA 72:27-a to readopt the provisions of the All Veterans' Tax Credit, RSA 72:28-b, and RSA 72:28-b:ll, known as the Optional Veterans' Tax Credit, In the amount of \$750.00 per year? If adopted, the following individuals will be eligible for the Veteran's Tax Credit: (a) every resident of this state who served not less than 90 days on active service in the armed forces of the United States in any qualifying war or armed conflict listed in RSA 72:28, V, and was honorably discharged or an officer honorably separated from service; or the spouse or surviving spouse of such resident, (b) every resident of this state who was terminated from the armed forces because of service-connected disability; or the surviving spouse of such resident; and (c) the surviving spouse of any resident who suffered a service-connected death.
