The overall bonding authority will not lapse until the project is completed but that the project will be completed by December 31, 2034, in annual increments, borrowing for which shall not exceed \$1,000,000 in any given year, and to take all other action relative thereto. Operating Budget Shall the Town of Newton raise and appropriate as an Operating Budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$4,519,182. Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$4,411,588, which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Newton or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. Majority Vote Required. The Board of Selectmen unanimously recommends a yes vote.
